

Have you ever wanted a wood-like background to one of your projects? If so, have you tried Deco Art's "Weathered Wood" product? You can use either the Deco Art product purchased from a hobby or craft shop or you can use the crackled wood product found at any home improvement store. It is really a pretty easy process to get this very unique look.

First seal your piece...that's important to do so it lasts and something we are all used to doing. Next put a good base coat on the piece...making sure you have covered it evenly and completely. Allow the base coat to dry thoroughly...I would suggest one to four hours. Next apply an even coat of the weathered/crackled wood product to your piece and then allow it to dry thoroughly again for one to four hours.

Now comes the fun part...apply a contrasting color of paint on top of the wood product just applied...making sure to apply your strokes in the same direction from top to bottom or from bottom to top. The crackling or splitting of color effect will occur during the top coat drying process...sit back and watch as it happens relatively quickly and the end result will amaze you.

A pattern can then be applied and painted as normal or you can simply varnish the piece with your favorite varnish type and enjoy the fruits of your labor!!


