Colored Pencils Again, How to Burnish



Burnishing is a technique used when finishing a project that you have created. Burnishing is covering the paper with pencil so that no more paper shows though. There is a nice sheen to your work and makes it have that "finished" look.

Burnishing is flattening out or filling in all the tooth of the paper with color.

There are several techniques that artists use. You can use a blending tool such as a stumps and tortillons or you can burnish with a colorless blending pencil. The pencil is made of wax or oil. As you use this blending pencil you will see how it pushes the color around, filling in all the white spaces and leaving a darker or brighter area. The burnishing does not change the color, but it gives it sheen.

There is also a technique for burnishing by using a white pencil or the same colored pencil with a little pressure. Using the white colored pencil will make a creamy color and perhaps not as bright. Trying to blend the colors by applying pressure with your pencils should be done when you know that this is the last layer of color that you desired.

This was a new technique I tried recently. Burnishing can also be done with **Vaseline.** Apply a small amount on a cotton swab or Q-Tip and cover the area lightly. It will brighten the area as well as give in softness. You can apply more color with this technique until you have the desired outcome for your project.

Colored pencils are not difficult. I believe it takes longer, but you can carry your project as you travel on vacation, to your art get together or from room to room in your home. There are so many new ways to display your work rather then framing it. With the glues and adhesives it can be placed on a surface and varnished just has you would a project made with acrylic paint.

2. CONTACTS/DQT OFFICERS

President: Janet Mitchell

1st Vice President: Carol Whitton & Diana Van Riel

2nd Vice President: Paula Maldonado

3. ALERTS

The emergency signal for each emergency (e.g. earthquake, fire, general evacuation) is the sound of the Faith Lutheran Church building fire alarm and/or verbal announcement by DQT Officer(s) listed above.

4. 4. PROCEDURE

In the event of fire or other emergency, the fire alarm will be activated. All building occupants shall immediately evacuate the building in an orderly manner except for Evacuation Warden (see #8). A DQT Officer will notify emergency response agency by dialing 911, and will provide details to 911 Operator re: the nature of the emergency.

5. ROUTES, EXITS

In the event of an emergency necessitating evacuation, all building occupants shall evacuate the building by means of the nearest available EXIT. The locations of all emergency exits, fire extinguishers, fire alarm stations, and assembly area will be made known to DQT members via verbal safety announcement during a general meeting on an annual basis.

6. 6. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

In the event of fire, individuals trained in the use of portable fire extinguishers may use this equipment to attempt to extinguish an INCIPIENT stage fire before evacuating.

7. OPERATIONS

Should the building be deemed unsafe to occupy by authorities, DQT Officers will convey to membership the logistical details re: future DQT Chapter meetings.

8. 8. DUTIES

The role of Evacuation Warden is currently assigned to DQT member, Catherine Schinhofen. When safe, the Evacuation Warden shall perform these duties:

a. make a final sweep of the restrooms, lobby, kitchen, adjacent rooms, etc.

- b. retrieve first aid kit for use at the designated assembly area
- c. ensure building doors are closed upon being the last person to exit
- d. inform future new members & guests of the emergency action plan

9. DESIGNATED ASSEMBLY AREA

After emergency evacuation, building occupants will gather at the far west end of parking lot. Assessment of injuries and provision of first aid can be conducted in the assembly area.

10. 10. ACCOUNTING

After emergency evcuation, the procedure for accounting of DQT members can be accomplished by roll call using the DQT member sign-in sheet and/or by simply asking, "Are your Tablemates here?"

II. NOTES

Emergency Action Plan (EAP) initially drafted and submitted by DQT member, Catherine Schinhofen on 08/04/2015 and revised on 05/03/2017. The EAP will be evaluated and updated by C. Schinhofen as needed, then submitted to DQT Officers for review. The EAP will be conveyed to the DQT membership by publishing in the DQT newsletter and/or by verbal announcement at a future

DQT chapter meeting.
